

NHS Patients

If you are an NHS patient, when paying for your treatment there are three different charges. Your treatment will determine which price band you will pay.

Band 1 and Urgent Treatment; £21.60

Band 2; £59.10

Band 3; £256.50

If you are aged under 18 or under 19 and in full time education you qualify for free NHS dental care. However if you are aged 19 and still in full time education this is no longer applicable and you will have to pay. You can apply for help with the cost of your treatment by asking for a HC1 form.

As an NHS patient it is important to keep regular attendance. If you lapse for a period of 24 months or more you will lose your NHS status with the practice. You will then only be able to re-register as a private patient.

As the National Health Service only gives us a limited time in which to see each patient, we would take this opportunity to inform you that, In agreement with the local Primary Care Trust if you fail to attend 3 appointments within a year you will lose your NHS status with this practice.
